



## Course Descriptor

### Child Protection: Reviewing Child Protection Concerns

#### Audience:

This ½ day workshop is suitable for:

- those who have responsibility for, or are likely to be involved in, the management, supervision or support of staff or volunteers
- child protection officers or board/committee members at a Scottish governing body of sport or sports club
- local authority/leisure trust staff such as sports development officers, club development officers, Active School Co-ordinators who support local sports clubs.

#### Workshop Pre-requisites:

Participants attending this workshop should have first attended a basic awareness course in child protection such as 'Safeguarding and Protecting Children' or equivalent as well as the 'In Safe Hands – Club Child Protection Officer' workshop.

#### The Workshop:

This workshop has been developed to compliment Step 9 of *10 Steps to Safeguard Children in Sport* which can be downloaded free from [www.safeguardingsport.org.uk](http://www.safeguardingsport.org.uk). Step 9 is designed to support sports organisations to monitor and review the management of concerns about poor practice, misconduct or child abuse. This workshop is based on the resource.

#### Workshop Aim:

The overall aim of this workshop is to help participants understand how to undertake a review of the management of a child protection concern, being clear about how to go about it.

#### Learning Outcomes:

By the end of the course participants will:

- be clear about the benefits of undertaking a review following a child protection concern
- understand the main stages involved
- have considered how such a review may be conducted in their organisation or club
